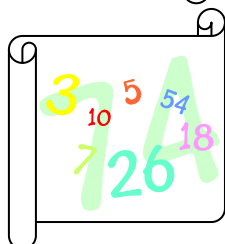

Dear Parents and Guardians,

This letter is designed to provide key information about learning this term.

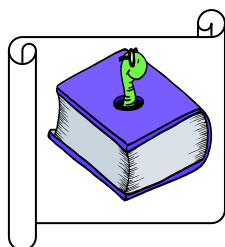
SUBJECT	CONTENT
English	In English this term, we will be developing our skills of speaking and listening for a wide range of purposes in different contexts. We will be reading and writing for a range of purposes with a focus on explanation texts, traditional tales and poetry. We will also be looking at the theme of dragons and writing stories about them.
Mathematics	In maths this term, we will be developing our understanding of number through recognising number facts and learning our times tables and division facts. We will also be learning about fractions of shape and number including $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{3}{4}$ and $\frac{1}{3}$. We will be using money and telling the time.
Science	In science this term, we will be focusing on animals, including humans. We will be looking at importance of exercise, hygiene, different types of food and what our bodies need to be healthy. We will be looking at the basic lifecycle of human and the changes that occur at each stage of the cycle.
Computing	In computing we will be focusing on Handling Data. We will collect information and then present this information using charts, tables and graphs using google sheets. Throughout the term, we will be look at e-safety and focus on how to use technology safely.
Geography	In Geography this term, we will be using maps and atlases to locate other places in the world, including identifying the human and physical features of a place. We will compare the island of Coll in Scotland with our own environment.
History	Our theme for History this term is focused on the Great Fire of London. We will develop our understanding of the events surrounding the fire by drawing on eye-witness accounts and sequencing timelines. We will explore the changes and developments made in building and technology as a result of the fire
RE	In our RE learning this term, we will be exploring what Christians believe about forgiveness and make links with the Easter Story.
RSE	Throughout our RSE learning this term, we will be discussing secrets which are safe and unsafe, the importance of—and how to recognise— appropriate touch, as well as keeping safe around medicine.
Music	Music this term will be based around five of the movements from <i>Carnival of the animals</i> , pupils will explore ways that the composer – Camille Saint-Saëns – has used instruments, rhythm, articulation, tempo, and pitch to create pictures of the animals in our imaginations.
D&T + Art	This half term, in art, we will be looking at the different buildings in school and in our local area. We will make a link to our local history. In the second half term, our DT topic will explore what makes a healthy diet. We will be tasting healthy food and designing and making our own healthy wraps. We will evaluate our creations and consider what improvements could be made in future.
PE	PE will be on a Wednesday this half term and we will be doing gymnastics. In these sessions we will be balancing and counter balancing. Learning to roll and performing various jumps. We will also be doing some apparatus work.

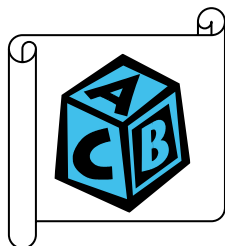
MATHS

Homework will frequently include activities to support and enhance classroom learning in maths. It is available online on the MyMaths website and printed on the back of the spelling activity sheet. Maths homework is set on a Friday and due on a Friday.



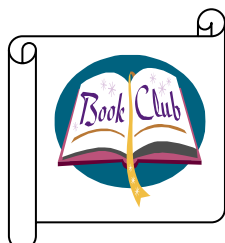
ENGLISH

Homework will frequently include activities to support spelling and enhance classroom learning in English. Written tasks should be completed using a sharp pencil rather than a pen. This is a good opportunity for children to reinforce good handwriting and accurate spelling. The activities may have a cross curricular link. Children should also be encouraged to write for pleasure at home.



SPELLING

Your child will bring home a spelling practise sheet on a Friday and will be tested on the words the following Friday. We work through the spelling patterns in class. Please regularly practise spellings ahead of the spelling test. Children should be confident with spelling the Year 2 common exception words.



READING

Please ensure that your child reads for 10-15 minutes every day.

Once you have listened to your child read, a few comments in the reading record book should be made. This is useful even if you choose to read a book that is not the scheme book that we have sent home. Reading records are to be handed in daily to be checked.
