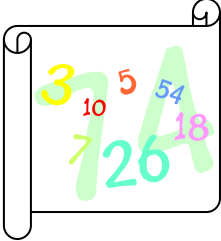

Dear Parents

This letter is designed to provide key information about learning this term.

SUBJECT	CONTENT
English	This term, we will be reading 'The Wind and the Willows'. We will analyse characters' behaviour and discuss different aspects of the story. We will be making inferences about characters to write in role. Later, we will write detailed descriptions, playscripts and autobiographies. For each writing piece, we will be planning, drafting, editing and improving our work. Every week, we will work on our comprehension skills and focus on a different reading objective including: making inferences, answering literal questions and prediction.
Mathematics	In maths this term, we will begin by securing our understanding of negative numbers. We will make links to everyday contexts; explore addition and subtraction below zero and across zero. We will apply our learning through measures and problem solving. We will then move on to multiplication and division. We will use short multiplication and division to multiply and divide 2 and 3 digit numbers by a single digit. We will then move on to learn about area and perimeter. We will continue to practice arithmetic skills and times tables daily.
Science	We will be learning about forces and investigating the effects of gravity, air resistance, water resistance and friction. We will move on to learn about living things and their habitats. The children will consolidate and extend previous learning on the life cycles of plants and animals, comparing and describing differences in the life cycles of mammals, amphibians, reptiles, birds and insects. They will learn how animals and plants reproduce.
Computing	This term, we will begin by learning how to keep ourselves safe online by keeping our personal details safe online. We will then move on to explore the world using Google Earth. We will use the programme scratch to explore and learn programming. We will develop our web detection skills and discuss how information online may not be accurate or reliable.
Geography	This term, we will be learning about coasts. We will begin by learning about ocean currents and gyres and move on to look at the features of coasts and coastal erosion. We will explore how coastlines are protected. We will use a range of different maps, research, diagrams and observations.
History	We will enjoy exploring the history of our local area. We will use both primary and secondary sources of information to learn about the history of Wiveliscombe and the surrounding areas. We will learn about prominent historical figures, events and landmarks in Wiveliscombe and learn how the area has changed over time.
D&T and Art	We will study Islamic art and look at how geometric and repetitive patterns, calligraphy and vegetal patterns are used in Islamic art. We will design and create our own stained glass windows. We will move on to make a moving picture book using different mechanisms.
RE	Our focus this term will be on Judaism. We will learn about the story of Abraham and focus on what Jewish people believe about God and the Covenant and Torah. We will move on to learn about Jewish traditions and festivals such as Bar/Bat Mitzvah, Yom Kippur and Rosh Hashanah.
PHSE/RSE	We will focus on keeping ourselves safe and being a good citizen. We will explore risky situations that the children may face in the future and discuss what we should do when faced with a risky situation. We will learn about drug education, including vaping and smoking.
Music	In Music, we will be using Sing Up to learn a range of songs. We will begin by learning an Islamic song called, Madina tun nabi. We will move on to learning 'Building A Grove'. Finally, we will learn to sing 'Epoca' together.
Modern Languages	Pupils learn to construct high numbers in French, develop food-related vocabulary through games, stories and role-play and build on their understanding of sentence structures, questions and phrases, equipping themselves with language they could use when shopping in France. They will go on to learn how to give and follow directions in French.
PE	This term, the children will begin by developing their skills in dance. They will focus on body and movement, choreography, sequencing and repetition and rhythm and expression. They will then move on to develop their netball skills with a focus on pivoting, passing, shooting, attacking and defending.

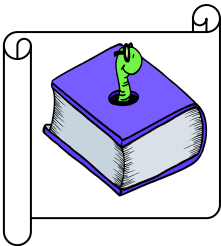
Homework

Consolidation of work carried out that week. This is set online on a Monday and due the following Monday. Your child should have their own log on and password to access this.

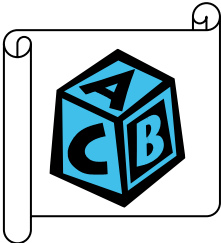
There will be a times tables of the week and children will practise daily in class. They have logins to www.timestables.co.uk where they can practise their times tables at home.

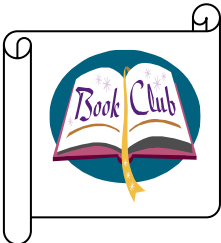
Children should also use this as an opportunity to practise their handwriting.

READING

Regular reading at home is essential. At least 3 times a week for 10 minutes to an adult is preferred with additional independent reading throughout the week

Reading record books should be signed by an adult when your child has read to you and returned every day with your child's reading book. They will be checked on Mondays.
