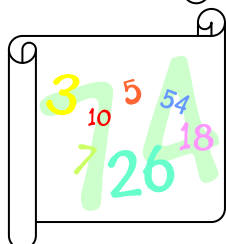

Dear Parents

This letter is designed to provide key information about learning this term.

SUBJECT	CONTENT
English	This term we will focus on a range of fiction and non-fiction genres. We will study character description, balanced arguments, writing in role, newspaper reports, explanatory text, narrative story writing, formal letters and we will learn and compose poetry. Every week, we will be revising and practising grammar structures and complex punctuation which the children will apply and use in their weekly writing. This term, we will be reading a wide range of texts and studying some excellent novels and poems which include The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane, Street Child and Mouse, Bird, Snake, Wolf.
Mathematics	In maths this term, we will begin by securing our understanding of decimals. We will begin by revising tenths, hundredths and thousandths and will use our knowledge to order, compare, round and calculate. We will apply our learning through measures and problem solving. We will then move on to begin place value. We will use the 'same sum' rule to balance equations and use strategies to help us with our mental calculations. We will focus on a times tables every week and practise daily.
Science	In science this term, we will be learning about changes in state. We will be comparing materials and using our knowledge of solids, liquids and gases to decide how to separate materials. We will learn about dissolving and give reasons, based on evidence from comparative and fair tests, for the particular uses of everyday materials, including metals, wood and plastic.
Computing	This term, we will begin by learning how to keep ourselves safe online by being kind and responsible. We will then move on to use data handling to learn more about the solar system and use multimedia to look at weather forecasts and use data from weather websites to create their own forecast.
Geography	This term, we will be learning about rivers. We will identify the key features of a river and look in detail at the River Tone. We will look at patterns between river formation and erosion and investigate rivers in North America and Europe.
History	We will enjoy learning about the interesting and exciting world of the Victorians. We will be studying what life was like in the Victorian times, what impact the industrial revolution had, what it was like to be rich and poor in Victorian times and we will be looking at the work and achievements of Dr Barnardo.
D & T and Art	We will study romanticism and William Turner and create our own compositions in the style of Turner. In the lead up to Christmas, we will use our sewing skills to design and make our own Christmas soft toys.
RE	Our focus this term will be on Christianity. We will focus on what Christians believe in relation to incarnation, God and salvation. The children will be encouraged to reflect and raise questions and learn what it is like to be a Christian.
PHSE/RSE	We will focus on relationships and valuing difference. We will focus on our differing emotions and how to manage them and learn why it is important to have mutual respect for people who have different beliefs, cultures and faiths to ourselves. We will also take part in mini police training.
Music	We will listening and learning to sing a variety of songs including, 'What shall we do with the drunken sailor?'. We are going to be learning how to play bass chords and using our bodies as percussion.
Modern Languages	In French, we will be learning about the French speaking world. We will discover the many French-speaking countries, give and follow directions in French and use prompts to ask and answer necessary questions to complete information on a passport.
PE	We will start the term by focusing on our social skills in PE where we will learn to co-operate well with others, give helpful feedback and guide a small group through a task. We will then move on to gymnastics.

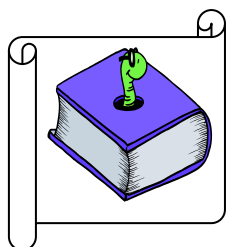
Homework

Consolidation of work carried out that week. This is set on Wednesday and due in the following Wednesday.

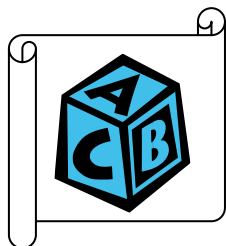
There will be a times tables of the week and children will practise daily in class. They have logins to www.timestables.co.uk where they can practise their times tables at home.

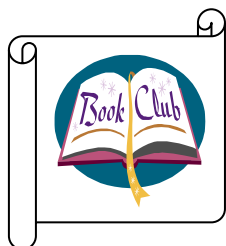
Children should also use this as an opportunity to practise their handwriting.

Reading record books should be signed by an adult when your child has read to you and returned every day with your child's reading book. They will be checked every Monday.
