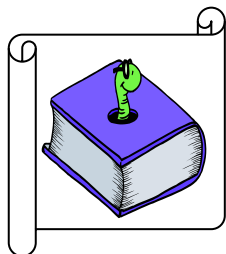

Dear parents and carers,

This letter is designed to provide key information about learning this term.

SUBJECT	CONTENT
Communication and Language	We will be listening to a range of different stories and start to practise re-telling. Throughout the Autumn term, we will be doing lots to support talking, interacting and listening to strengthen our conversational skills. We will also be exploring how to use talk effectively to help solve conflicts and work out problems. Communication and Language is used constantly throughout all our learning and teaching in Early Years.
Personal, Social and Emotional Development	In PSED this Autumn term, we will be covering the topics 'Me and My Relationships' and 'Valuing Difference'. The 'Me and My Relationships' topic will be covered in the first Autumn term and will focus on feelings, what makes me special and who are people who can help me. In Autumn term 2, 'Valuing Difference' will be looking into different types of families and homes, ways to be kind and caring and valuing that everyone is special in their own way.
Physical Development	We will be learning how to follow instructions, practise safely and work on simple tasks independently as well as looking at ways we can become increasingly independent at meeting our own care needs, including changing our clothes. Throughout the Autumn term, we will be practising and perfecting our pencil grip and becoming increasingly good with control. In PD, we will be developing movement, coordination and balancing through games and dance.
Literacy	In Literacy, we are going to teach and reinforce phonic skills through the use of 'Bug Club' Phonics. We are going to be focusing on writing our own name and letter formations. Throughout the term, we are going to be doing activities to ensure we can name and recognise letters of the alphabet. We will begin to say and write simple three letter words using our phonics knowledge and will be learning some sight words and high frequency words.
Mathematics	In maths, we will be practising writing and recognising numbers up to 10. Some activities will focus on ordering numbers and linking numerals with amounts. We will be recognising and drawing 2D shapes as well as naming some 3D shapes. We will be looking at creating repeating patterns and start to become confident to describe them. We will begin to use language such as 'more than' and 'fewer than' when comparing quantities. During the term, we will be exploring height, length, weight and capacity. Throughout the Autumn term, we will be using the Bee Bots to learn about programming and start to become familiar with propositional language.
Understanding of the world	As we will be going into Autumn, we will cover changes in seasons and will be exploring our local environment through 'Welly Walks', alongside exploring our garden space in EYFS. We will also be looking at our birthdays and the months of the year. Linking with our 'Amazing Me' topic, we will be talking about members of our families as well as some important roles in society. We will be looking at different types of families and homes and start to be able to describe and create a simple map of our immediate surroundings. Our 'Let's Celebrate' topic will cover some important religious festivals, such as Hanukkah, Diwali and of course, Christmas.
Expressive Arts and Design	We are going to be looking at creating self-portraits throughout the term. When looking at the changing seasons, we will be developing our drawing skills through observational drawing. We will be exploring painting with different mediums. We will be developing their engagement with a range of different role play. Throughout the Autumn term, we will be develop fine motor skills through cutting, sticking and the use of sensory trays. During the Autumn term, we will be developing the children's enjoyment of music through singing and listening to different kinds of music and rhymes. Nearer to Christmas, we will be rehearsing and participating in the Nativity Play.

Please encourage your child to read their school reading book everyday.

When you have read with your child, please sign in their reading diary. Their key words will also need to be practised at home and will be changed every Tuesday.

Forest School—Our Forest school session will be on a Wednesday morning. Please bring children into school in their outdoor clothes and wearing school shoes. We will change them into their wellies once in school. They should bring their uniform to change back into for afterwards. Outdoor clothing should consist of clothes that you don't mind them getting dirty and currently, waterproof trousers, hats, scarfs and gloves may be required.

Water bottles—Please send your child in with a named water bottle everyday, containing only water.

Snack—Your child is welcome to bring a healthy snack with them to school for break time. Please note that we are a nut-free school and therefore do not permit any items containing nuts.

Please ensure that all clothing, lunchboxes and water bottles are clearly named.
