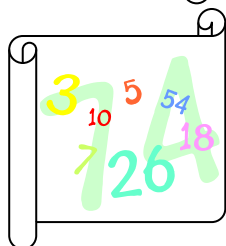

Dear Parents

This letter is designed to provide key information about learning this term.

SUBJECT	CONTENT
English	Our English learning this term will explore a range of texts which includes classic children's literature, modern fiction and a range of non-fiction genres. We will be recapping and strengthening our knowledge of grammatical terms and punctuation in order to support our ability to write in these different genres.
Mathematics	This term, we will be exploring statistics as our first focus, as well as revising key concepts which we have covered throughout the year. We will also be investigating properties of shape and how our knowledge of the four operations, fractions, decimals and percentages can be used in these contexts.
Science	During this term, we will be continuing our learning on electricity by investigating and experimenting with the impact of different voltages, resistors and components within simple circuits. We will also be exploring light, developing our understanding of how we are able to see, how light travels and shadows.
Computing	Our computing curriculum will develop our understanding of technology in our lives by deepening our knowledge of networking. We will also be collecting and handling data using a range of resources.
Topic	During this term, we will be continuing our learning on the second world war, as well as moving into our summer topic of Crime and Punishment across different periods in history. In Geography, we will be developing our geographical skills including reference to map reading.
RE	Our RE this term will be exploring Humanism as a philosophy as well as the Christian belief of Salvation.
PE	During this half term, we will be developing our individual skills in a range of athletics in addition to our swimming lessons. There will also be an opportunity to develop our striking and fielding skills in rounders in extra-curricular opportunities. Our Forest School sessions will strengthen our abilities in fundamental movement.
Modern Languages	This term, we will be learning how to read and write passages, speak and listen to phrases which discuss position and direction, where we live and places in towns.
D & T & Art	This term's art topic will allow us to develop our mastery of textiles by studying different fashions. In DT, we will be exploring the role of electrical components and pneumatics.
Music	Our production will provide plentiful opportunities for developing our singing and performing this term, as well as a Charanga theme of 'Music and Me'.
RSE	This term, we will be looking at how we can develop our resilience and personal skills to 'be our best'. We will also be understanding how our body grows and changes.

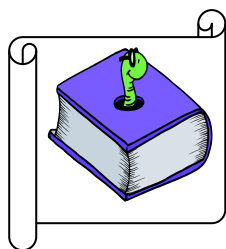


MATHS

Children should continue to rehearse their times tables so that they know all number facts up to 12 x 12 fluently and accurately, including division facts

Children should recall number bonds to 1 fluently e.g. $0.36 + \underline{\quad} = 1$

Homework is set on a Thursday and is due on a Wednesday. This will regularly consolidate our mathematical learning.

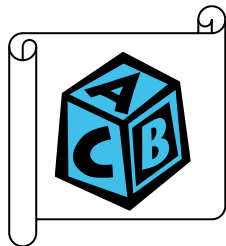


ENGLISH

Children should regularly practise their handwriting

Children should be encouraged to write for pleasure at home

Homework is set on a Thursday and is due on a Wednesday. This will regularly consolidate our English grammar learning.

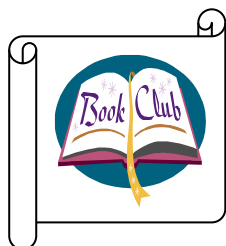


SPELLING

Weekly spelling tests will be set every Friday and tested the following Friday.

Spellings should be practised everyday including lists from previous weeks.

Children should be able to spell all words from the Y5/6 statutory Word List.



READING

Regular reading at home is encouraged. At least 3 times a week for 15 minutes to an adult is preferred, including questions about what has been read.

Reading record books should be signed by an adult when your child has read to you and returned every day with your child's reading book.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- ◆ PE kits are to be in school at all times. (Black/ dark blue shorts, plain house coloured t-shirt, daps or trainers and black/ dark blue tracksuit bottoms for colder weather) Our PE session is now on a Wednesday.
- ◆ Children should bring appropriate Forest School Clothes for our session on a Thursday afternoon.
- ◆ Homework:
 - Given on a Thursday and returned on a Wednesday
 - Spelling Test and Reading Records checked each Friday
- ◆ Additional homework will also be set as required. Spellings will always be recorded in children's reading records on a Friday.
